# History

In 1956 Shanti Solomon traveled through Asia as part of Pacific Mission Team, organized by Margaret Shannon of the National Office of the Presbyterian Women in the U.S., seeking reconciliation among women from war-torn countries. Refused entry into Korea. Shanti waited and prayed for inspiration while in the Philippines. She sought guidance for healing relationships among women of different cultures and countries. She envisioned women praying for each other across boundaries, setting aside a coin as a symbol of their sincerity. The Fellowship of the Least Coin (FLC) movement was born when other team members embraced her vision. From 1958 to 1970. the Asian Church Women's Conference promoted the FLC, with the East Asia Christian Conference

### Vision and Mission

The Fellowship of the Least Coin has flourished as a global ecumenical women's prayer movement. The key to the movement's success is its simplicity. Individuals or groups may join by committing to pray for peace, iustice, and reconciliation among families and communities, and worldwide. Each time a woman prays, she sets aside the least coin of her local currency as a symbol of the prayer. Women's national groups collect the coins and send them to the central FLC Fund c/o World Council of Churches in Geneva, Switzerland. The prayers offered and the least coins collected support projects for women and children around the world.

#### **ICFLC**

Since 1979 the International Committee for the FLC (ICFLC), comprised of the various global and regional ecumenical organizations which support FLC, has administered the promotion and interpretation of the movement. The ICFLC meets annually to discuss regional reports, to learn and to share in solidarity with sisters around the world. Committee members allocate grants prayerfully, supporting programs that address:
